

STATESIDE LATINOS: 2005

This *Latino Policy Datanote* is based on the March 2006 Current Population Survey (CPS), a monthly survey of about 50,000 households stateside (excluding US territories) conducted by the Bureau of the Census for the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The survey has been conducted for more than 50 years. All numbers with decimal points in the table below are percentages.
